Windsor's unemployment rate has increased again for the month of December to 7.6 percent compared to last month's value of 7.0 percent.

This month the labour force remains consistent with last month's value and the amount of individuals employed has decreased once again resulting in a higher rate of unemployment.

There was an increase in jobs in the professional, scientific and technical services sector, while job losses occurred within the construction sector.
