Windsor's unemployment rate has remained the same compared to last month and is currently higher than both the Ontario and Canada rates.

The labour force shrunk by 2,800 people to 183,800 from a record high number in May.

The overall population that is currently employed in the Windsor CMA has also decreased compared to last month's values.

We have seen a slight decrease in numbers this month, however, they are still higher than this time last year.

Employment in the manufacturing sector experienced a decrease of 2000 jobs in June. This loss of jobs was not a localized issue as there was a decline of 15,000 manufacturing jobs nationally. The wholesale and retail trade sector also experienced a decrease of 1,200 jobs.

The finance, insurance and real estate sectors generated 1,800 new jobs. Accommodation and food added 1,200 jobs and construction added 1,000 jobs.

Deliverbae Inc., a general home delivery service, launched in Windsor this month and currently employees approximately 30 people with plans for future expansion.

Windsor Fire & Rescue Services hired 11 new firefighters.

Starbucks will close its café in downtown Windsor at the end of July 2019. No official numbers were provided with respect to job losses.

FCA Canada will extend the third shift at its Windsor Assembly Plant to October 21, instead of September 30, as a result of a new fleet order.
