The unemployment rate rose slightly in the Windsor CMA from January to February despite a reduction in the size of the labour force, as the number of people employed decreased by 2,100. However, the local unemployment rate remained below those of the province and country. Employment in Manufacturing dropped slightly, as did Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Finance, Insurance and Real Estate showed an increase, along with Accommodation and Food Services. Youth unemployment increased from 10.5% in January to 13.6% in February (unadjusted for seasonality).
